# About EISTCP

Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credit Program

The Virginia Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credit Program gives state tax credits to persons or businesses donating to scholarship foundations that provide scholarships to students attending private schools.



To qualify for a scholarship, students must be Virginia residents entering a private school in Virginia and meet household income guidelines.

## APPLY NOW

### Qualifying Students

A family must complete a Family Application to qualify for a scholarship award. Funds for any student will be paid directly to their participating school with semi-annual payments during the school term.

For a family to be eligible to receive a scholarship, annual household income must not exceed 300% of current federal poverty guidelines (in 2016, \$72,750 for a family of four). A household with a student with a disability must not exceed 400% of current federal poverty guidelines.

Scholarship funds can be awarded only to children entering a private school as a kindergartener or first grader, or transferring from a public school. However, after a child has received a scholarship he is eligible in following years if the household meets the income guidelines.

Scholarship funds from ASFVA are only available at schools that donors have recommended us to support with their contributions.

Anabaptist Scholarship Foundation of Virginia, a 501(c)(3) organization, was formed in 2014 to accommodate donations made through the Virginia Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credit Program.
